

## GREYHOUND WELFARE & INTEGRITY COMMISSION DISCIPLINARY ACTION DECISION

	Mr. Vallario did a thing which, in the opinion of the Controlling Body, constitutes an offence by engaging in an activity which constitutes misconduct.
Plea:	Guilty
Disciplinary action taken:	To issue a nine-month suspension, to commence December 1 <sup>st</sup> , 2023, and expire 1 <sup>st</sup> September 2024

## **DECISION:**

- 1. Mr. Vallario was, at all relevant times, a registered Trainer and Owner with the Greyhound Welfare and Integrity Commission.
- 2. In a text message dated 10.37am, 25<sup>th</sup> October 2023, Mr. Vallario used offensive language in relation to an Officer of a Club.
- 3. On 2 November 2023 Mr. Vallario was issued with a notice of charge and proposed disciplinary action ("**Notice**"). The Notice issued a charge against him for breach of the following Greyhound Racing Rule:

## Charge - Rule 165(c)(a)(iii), Rules

An offence is committed if a person (including an official):

...

- (a) engages in contemptuous, unseemly, improper, insulting or offensive conduct or behaviour in any manner or form towards, or in relation to:
  - (iv) a Club, or an officer, employee or member of a Club;

- 4. The Notice invited Mr. Vallario to attend a hearing on Thursday 30 November 2023 and to enter a plea and make submissions in relation to the charge.
- 5. At the hearing conducted on Thursday 30 November Mr. Vallario;
  - Entered a plea of guilty; and
  - Made verbal submissions.
- 6. After considering Mr. Vallario's plea and verbal submissions, the decision-makers found the charge proven and took the following disciplinary action against him:
- **Charge** To issue a nine-month suspension, to commence December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, and expire 1<sup>st</sup> September 2024
- 8. In taking this disciplinary action, the decision-makers considered all evidence, including:
  - Mr. Vallario's Guilty plea
  - Mr. Vallario's 18-year history in the industry and that this was Mr. Vallario's 4<sup>th</sup> offence for conduct related matters since 2020
  - Personal and professional circumstances
  - Principles of specific and general deterrence and what message is sent to the industry in respect to such conduct.
