

# GREYHOUND WELFARE & INTEGRITY COMMISSION DISCIPLINARY ACTION DECISION

Charge(s): (1) Mr Gittoes presented the greyhound 'Amy Schraff'

("Greyhound") for the purposes of competing in race 2 at the Dubbo meeting on 22 February 2019 in circumstances where

the Greyhound was not free of any prohibited substance.

Prohibited substance(s): Cobalt

**Disciplinary action taken:** 12-week suspension

### REPORT:

Following receipt of a certificate of analysis from the Racing Analytical Services Laboratory, the Commission conducted an investigation into the results of a pre-race urine sample taken from the greyhound, 'Amy Schraff' ("**Greyhound**") at the Dubbo meeting on 22 February 2019.

Further analysis of the sample was conducted by the Racing Chemistry Laboratory, confirming the presence of cobalt at a mass concentration of 130 nanograms per millilitre.

After considering the evidence, the Commission charged Mr Gittoes with a breach of Rule 83(2)(a) of the Commission's Greyhound Racing Rules ("Rules") given that pre-race urine sample taken from the Greyhound confirmed the presence of prohibited substance cobalt above the threshold imposed by Rule 83(10) of 100 nanograms per millilitre.

On Wednesday, 3 July 2019, this matter was heard before the Commission in the first instance under section 58(3) of the *Greyhound Racing Act 2017* (NSW) and Rule 92 of the Rules, at the election of the participant.

Mr Gittoes represented himself at the hearing.

Mr Gittoes pleaded not guilty to the charge.

#### **DECISION:**

## Charge

- 1. Mr Gittoes is a registered greyhound trainer and the trainer of the Greyhound. The Greyhound was presented for race 2 at the Dubbo meeting on 22 February 2019 ("Event") and a pre-Event urine sample was taken from the Greyhound.
- 2. The pre-Event swab revealed the presence of cobalt at a mass concentration of 130 nanograms per millilitre.
- 3. The Commission charged Mr Gittoes under Rule 83(2)(a), which reads:
  - (2) The owner, trainer or person in charge of a greyhound-
    - (a) nominated to compete in an Event;
    - (b) presented for a satisfactory, weight or whelping trial or such other trial as provided for pursuant to these Rules; or
    - (c) presented for any test or examination for the purpose of a period of incapacitation or prohibition being varied or revoked

shall present the greyhound free of any prohibited substance.

- 4. Mr Gittoes plead not guilty to the charge and made submissions in relation to the charge, including the likely source of the positive result being a supplement and feeding regime of his greyhounds during the summer months to aid the hydration of his greyhounds.
- 5. The Commission found the charge proven and Mr Gittoes formally guilty of the offence on the following basis;
  - The presentation of the Greyhound for the purposes of competing in the Event by Mr Gittoes, the registered trainer of the Greyhound;
  - Mr Gittoes' submissions in relation to the likely source of the contamination, following his review of his feeding practices and the conduct of research.

## **Penalty**

- 6. Cobalt, at a mass concentration greater than 100 nanograms per millilitre is a prohibited substance under Rule 83(10) of the Rules. Cobalt was detected in the pre-Event swab at a mass concentration of 130 nanograms per millilitre. Cobalt is a category 4 prohibited substance under the NSW greyhound racing penalty guidelines.
- 7. Mr Gittoes made submissions in relation to penalty, including in relation to registration and disciplinary history, his remorse, the review of his animal husbandry practices and his personal and financial circumstances.
- 8. The Commission, after hearing Mr Gittoes' submissions in relation to penalty, took the following disciplinary action against Mr Gittoes:

To suspend his trainer registration for a period of 12 weeks.

- 9. In taking this disciplinary action, the Commission considered all evidence, including:
  - Mr Gittoes has been a registered trainer for over 8 years;
  - Mr Gittoes has no history of any prohibited substance matters;
  - NSW greyhound racing penalty guidelines and precedents;
  - Mr Gittoes' submissions in mitigation of penalty.
- 10. In addition, the Greyhound was disqualified from race 2 at the Dubbo meeting on 22 February 2019 pursuant to Rule 83(4), which reads:

(4) A greyhound presented for an Event pursuant to sub-rules (1) or (2) shall be
