

Rehoming Policy

Temperament Assessments



During the rehoming process a temperament assessment may be required if there are concerns the greyhound may not be suitable for rehoming due to behavioral issues.

Temperament assessments must be completed by a veterinary practitioner or other person approved by GRNSW.

Steps to have a temperament assessment completed

- Step: 1 Contact GWIC to request the list of GRNSW approved temperament assessors.
- Step: 2 Download and print the Referral for a Temperament Assessment form.
- Step: 3 Visit the greyhound's regular vet and request a referral for a temperament assessment (vet to complete referral).
- Step: 4 Book an assessment with an approved vet/other approved person in your area.
- Step: 5 Download and print the Temperament Assessment Report template, and take along to the assessment. Please also take the vet's referral form.
- Step: 6 Assessor to complete the report.
- Step: 7 Assessor to provide GRNSW and participant with the completed report.

Advising GWIC of the assessment outcome

The Greyhound Rehoming Policy permits euthanasia of a greyhound that has been assessed as unsuitable for rehoming. If your greyhound is unsuitable and you choose to have it euthanased, you must then submit a Euthanasia of Greyhound – Vet Certification form and the completed Temperament Assessment Report

Once this has been done, the participant must submit the following to GWIC at registration@gwic.nsw.gov.au;

- Euthanasia of Greyhound - Vet Certification form, and
- the completed Temperament Assessment Report.

Temperament Assessment payment

Temperament assessments will be paid for by GRNSW.

Once the assessment has been finalised and the report has been submitted to GRNSW and the participant, the vet or other approved person are to invoice GRNSW directly for payment. Please email vets@grnsw.com.au to arrange payment.
