

HOW TO....

Prevent periodontitis (gum) disease

- CARE regular home dental care including daily brushing, the use of dental rinses and dental chews.
 Ask your vet for further advice.
- FARE the inclusion of whole raw meaty bones in the diet a few times a week.
- AWARE annual veterinary health check which should include a thorough dental examination.





1 July 2023 - Changes to registration fees

After four years of no increases, GWIC has announced changes to some fees and the introduction of new fees for some services. From 1 July 2023 some registration and transaction fees charged by the Commission will change.

While fees will be introduced for new applications for registration as a Greyhound Owner and Breeder, registration renewals for Owners and Breeders will continue to be free and renewal fees will no longer be charged for Race Officials.

Fees will now be charged for registering a breeding female or changing the name of a greyhound in line with other states.
