Charles Sultana matter finalised

Former NSW greyhound racing participant, Charles Sultana, has had his registrations disqualified for life following a conviction of seven (7) animal welfare charges on 2 May 2019.

Mr Sultana was charged by the RSPCA NSW after failing to provide veterinary treatment to 12 greyhounds for a number of conditions following two (2) inspections of his Marsden Park property in July 2018.

Mr Sultana entered a plea of guilty to all charges and was convicted before the Blacktown Local Court on 13 June 2019.

The Commission considered all evidence against Mr Sultana and after finding a charge under

Rule 95(8)(a)(i) of the Commission's Greyhound Racing Rules proven, on 31 July 2019 took disciplinary action against Mr Sultana to disqualify his registrations for life.
