## HOW TO.... check-in your greyhound

1.You will receive an SMS or email when your greyhound/s are due for a check-in.

2. Visit the eTrac map on the GWIC website to find your nearest check-in location and make an appointment.

3. Attend your check-in appointment with your greyhound/s. It takes 30 seconds to scan and check-in each greyhound and information is updated in the eTrac system immediately.

When a greyhound is retired outside of the industry, it is placed onto the NSW Pet Register.

Greyhounds that are retired to an industry participant stay registered with GWIC.

#### Code of Practice - ESE Plan

Standard 7.12 of the Greyhound Welfare Code of Practice requires trainers to document an Exercise, Socialisation and Enrichment Plan (ESE Plan) for the greyhounds at their kennels.

A template is available on the GWIC website to help trainers meet this standard.

A reminder that greyhounds need to be identified by a GWIC steward before their maiden start.

Stewards suggest getting your greyhound identified prior to race day to avoid any issues.

Consider attending the track with your greyhound the week before their maiden race so that you are ready to go on race day.
