HOW TO....

Register as a breeder

Many greyhound owners and trainers also register as breeders. To register as a breeder, visit www.gwic.nsw.gov.au/breeders and follow the steps below.

- 1. Read the Greyhound Welfare Code of Practice and the Being a Greyhound Breeder handbook
- 2. Ensure your facilities meet the standards required by the Code
- 3. Complete the online Registration Knowledge Test
- 4. Download your certificate of achievement
- 5. Submit your application

The online Registration Knowledge Test is to confirm you have the basic knowledge to perform the role of a breeder, and understand the obligations.

Flea & tick season fast approaching

With summer on its way it's time to start protecting your greyhounds from fleas & ticks.

Owners that are rehoming a greyhound to a person or organisation outside of the industry are required to desex the greyhound before it is rehomed.

You can access financial help through GRNSW's Homing Assistance Scheme to help cover the cost of desexing, dental and booster vaccinations.

Code of Practice - Bedding

Section 5 of The Greyhound Welfare Code of Practice outlines the housing environment requirements for greyhounds.

Requirements include:

- a raised bed or wooden pallet, big enough for the greyhound to stretched out on;
- bedding that is warm, soft, dry and safe;
- privacy from other greyhounds while asleep.

From the Stewards' Box



On 1 May 2022, all states and territories adopted the new Greyhounds Australasia National Greyhound Racing rules. At the same time, the Commission introduced a number of new Local Rules:

- LR 166A Lay betting
- LR 47A Interstate participants operating in NSW
- LR 122A Abandoned greyhounds

These accompany LR 58A (Breeding exemptions) and LR 92A (Pin-firing) which were introduced on 17 December 2021.
