Using traffic lights to stop infection

When it comes to protecting the health of your greyhounds in the event of an infectious disease, we recommend using the 'traffic light' system.



Red: Greyhounds with confirmed infection. Isolate from other greyhounds. Keep bedding etc separate.



Yellow: Been in contact with infected greyhound, but shows no signs of illness. Keep these greyhounds separate from healthy and infected greyhounds.

Code of Practice

Part 8: Training, Trialling and Racing



Greyhounds must be presented for examination by an On-Track Veterinarian prior to starting in a race



Any injury suffered by a greyhound during a race must be reported by the participant to the attending steward and On-Track Veterinarian



Any request made by a steward or On-Track Veterinarian to seek veterinary treatment for a greyhound must be followed.
