## Clearance trial? Remember C5 vax

Greyhounds must be vaccinated to a C5 level annually to compete in a race or a clearance trial (including return to trials).

Vaccinating your greyhounds to C5 level ensures we are doing all we can to prevent the spread of infectious canine diseases.

Use the **eTrac portal** to send us proof of vaccination.



Your greyhound cannot trial for **5 days** after being vaccinated.



## Short-term or long-term stay - notify us

If your greyhound has a change in premises from where it is ordinarily kept - for example for rearing or breaking - you must submit a kennel notification.

The notification must be submitted via eTrac within three days of the change and regardless of how short the stay may be.



## From the Stewards' box

**TOENAIL REMINDER:** Trainers are advised that stewards may order the scratching of a greyhound from a meeting if, at the time of examination at kennelling, an officiating veterinarian or authorised person identifies the length of a greyhound's toenails makes it unsuitable to compete.



## Do you Race Well?


Has your greyhound been prescribed non steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs?

These medications

are **prohibited substances** and must

not be present in a greyhound's system on race day.

Remember to use the free Race Well app to check the status of these medications.




A participant must be registered as a breeder-whelp to care for a pup that is not fully vaccinated, microchipped and registered.



## Code of practice

### Part 7: Exercise, Socialisation and Enrichment



All greyhounds which are being spelled or bred or which are retired must be provided with access to toys for a minimum of one hour each day.

With the exception of retired greyhounds, they must also be provided with a minimum of one hour exercise in an area outside the greyhound housing area, either through walking on a lead or access to an exercise yard each day.
