Formally identifying your greyhound

The reliable identification of greyhounds is a fundamental integrity measure for the NSW greyhound racing industry.

That is why we encourage participants to have greyhounds formally identified by a GWIC steward prior to their first race meeting.

The steward will check your greyhound's microchip can be found and read.



Seeking permission?

A reminder that unless you have prior approval from the Commission, surrendering a registered greyhound to a pound or shelter is **NOT** permitted.

Approval will be granted only where the facility has a no-euthanasia policy in place.
